Useful tips for filming and editing





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Think about editing while you're shooting.
If possible, place the camera on a tripod or stabilizer.

Use a flapper or just clap before starting a take/frame: this will make it much easier to combine sound and video on the montage.
Think about the lighting: is there enough light for you? The best option is to put two or three lamps on.

• Remember to record audio separately, not relying only on the camera microphone. Make sure that the speaker's figure is not located in the very center, and occupies not more than ²/₃ frame. Focus the camera on

- their face.
- Make sure that the frame is not illuminated. Shooting in the shade is preferable to shooting in natural sunlighting.

 If you were shooting on several cameras, alternate the cameras on the installation to get different angles.

- Adjust the color: balance the video by tone, bringing the colors to one warmth.
- Remember: if you attach music, it should not overlap the voice.
- If you need subtitles, choose a font size of at least 90 pt so that they are visible on smartphones. Use simple fonts.
